World Water Monitoring Challenge™ 2012

A re-launch of the popular World Water Monitoring Day, is an international education and outreach programme that builds public awareness and involvement in protecting water resources around the world by engaging citizens to conduct basic monitoring of their local water bodies. The expanded timeframe for monitoring from March 22 until end of the year has boosted the programme participation considerably. In 2011, nearly 340,000 people monitored their waterways in 77 countries.

About 200 students from local primary and secondary schools namely MRSM Langkawi, Maktab Mahmud Langkawi and Sekolah Rendah Islam Darul Ulum will connect with their local water bodies to test the **temperature, pH, turbidity** and **dissolved oxygen** through a series of simple hands-on monitoring tests using the Test Kit provided and share their findings worldwide at the official website: www.monitorwater.org.

Alongside with MWA objective to share and disseminate information on water related issues, we have successfully conducted the event since 2005 with participation from various parties including water supply entities, government agencies, public and private organisations, schools as well as individuals. Some of the water bodies that have been tested were Sg. Penchala (TTDI), Sg. Kinta (Ipoh), Serada Intake (Terengganu), Sg. Kuantan (Pahang), Sg. Petani (Kedah), Air Terjun Kota Tinggi (Johor), Tebing Sg. Melaka (Melaka), Sg. Terip Dam (Negeri Sembilan), Sg. Lutong (Sarawak), Teluk Bahang Dam (Pulau Pinang), Hutan Bandar Putra Kulaijaya (Johor), Sg. Kelantan, Sg. Keladi, Sg. Pengkalan Datu and Sg. Pangkal Mulong (Kelantan).

The message is to encourage people everywhere to **test** the quality of their waterways, **share** their findings, and **protect** our most precious resource.
